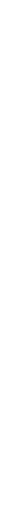
## **2 .PRESENTATION BY “PARAS” ON SUCCESSFUL CAREER ASPECT IN SPOKEN ENGLISH AND PERSONALITY DEVELOPMENT.**

A program was organized by PARAS on 13<sup>th</sup> February 2017 that emphasized the importance of English language and Personality development in regards with career aspect. The highlights of the program were, that it consists of 3 LEVEL”s of 215 hours for 3 years in totality. Where by 1st year program as Beginner (75 hours), 2nd year Intermediate (70 hours) and 3rd year advance (70 hours).Each year program has 4 verticals i.e. English language (60 hours), personality development (10 hours), career counseling (10 hours) and current affairs(10 hours) & 10 hours for role play, quiz, puzzle and participative activities. On successful completion of each level, candidate gets an international certification from Global Language institute for training and research (London-UK) and promoted to another level which will help in overcome the phobia of English speaking, confidence and career planning. ## **3.ANTI RAGGING LECTURES BY DR.PAHARIYA :**







An Orientation lecture was delivered by Dr Yogesh Pahariya (HOD & Prof. at GRMC, Gwalior) on anti-ragging. He emphasized on values of students life and healthy college environment. College campus is a place to find valuable friendship and to cherish unforgettable moments. We, here at MAHARANAPRATAP COLLEGE OF DENTISTRY & RESEARCH CENTRE strongly condemn any kind of ragging practices. Our students welcome the fresher's with flowers and advices and they do not believe in violence or unhealthy practices. Our faculty members impart good values with education and that is what set MPCD & RC apart.

### **What constitutes Ragging –**

Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts :

- any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
- indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
- any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;

- any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student ;
- any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

## **Actions Suggested against students indulging and abetting in Ragging**

1. The punishment to be meted out to the persons indulged in ragging has to be exemplary and justifiably harsh to act as a deterrent against recurrence of such incidents. The students who are found to be indulged in ragging should be debarred from taking admission in any technical institution in India.
2. Every single incident of ragging a First Information Report (FIR) must be filed without exception by the institutional authorities with the local police authorities
3. Depending upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution, the possible punishments for those found guilty of ragging at the institution level shall be any one or any combination of the following.
4. Cancellation of admission
5. Suspension from attending classes
6. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits
7. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process
8. Withholding results
9. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
10. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel

Rustication from the institution for period ranging from 1 to 4 semesters

1. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
2. Fine of Rupees 25,000/-
3. Collective punishment: when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on the potential raggers.
4. The institutional authority shall intimate the incidents of ragging occurred in their premises along with actions taken to the Council immediately after occurrence of such incident and inform the status of the case from time to time.

5. Courts should make an effort to ensure that cases involving ragging are taken up on priority basis to send the correct message that ragging is not only to be discouraged but also to be dealt with sternness.

*Do not be a victim or witness!! Say No to Ragging!!*

### **3.Screening & Treatment CAMPS Organized by Institute :**

Every month our Public Health and Community dentistry department are organizing various camps in and around Gwalior. The main aim of these camps is to bring about awareness regarding oral health among population.

Our main aim remains strong , and that is to provide high end dental health care to the needy and the underprivileged for free. During these camps the patients are clinically checked and for any treatment procedure or follow up they are asked to come to our dental hospital where they are treated free or at concession rates. Various camps held this year.

### **4.“Rahat 2017” Camp**



On 6<sup>th</sup> February to 13<sup>th</sup> February 2017 a comprehensive medical and dental camp was organized in Morena by state government, our institute played a major role in providing dental checkup and treatment during the camp. A team of experts comprising of dental doctors and para medical staff and dental students were sent to provide the required services .Almost 2500 to 3000 dental patients were screened and treatment was provided via mobile dental van. Many needy and the underprivileged patients got benefit from this

camp. Some treatments that required lengthy procedures were done with in the college free of cost.

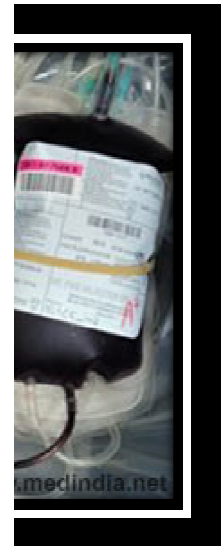
#### **5. Medical and Dental CAMP on 28<sup>st</sup> May 2017 At RDMH, Gwalior.**

### ○ GANESH POOJA



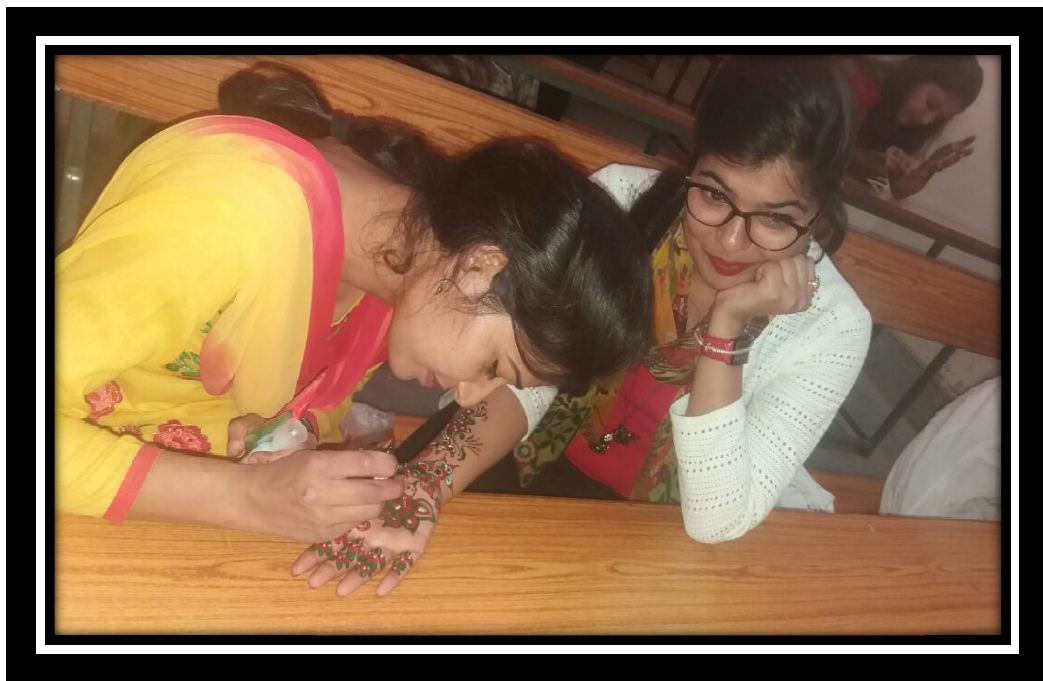

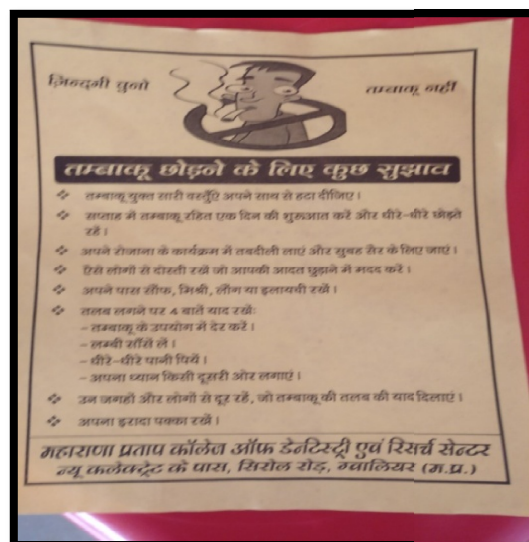


## ○ YOGA DAY
